The Jubilee marked not only a celebration of the past but also the beginning of a new chapter of self-reliance and educational excellence.



The following day, as the school celebrated the 90th Birth Anniversary of His Holiness the Dalai Lama, the group visited **Hemis Monastery** to witness the sacred mask dance festival and experience the spiritual richness of Ladakh.

After the celebration, the sponsors began their journey to the Changthang plateau, visiting branch schools nestled among the high mountains. They were welcomed with songs, dances, and heartfelt smiles from students and staff. That evening, the group camped on the meadows of **Nyoma Village**, where laughter and stories continued under the starry Ladakhi sky. Upon their return to Germany, Shelter 108 continued their generous support. They funded **smart televisions and a washing machine** for Sumdo Nyoma and Hanley branch School, located far from the city, along with **iron storage boxes** to protect rations from insects and rodents. They also pledged to support TCV Leh by funding the construction of a **study-cum-dining hall** for boarding children—a long-awaited facility that will greatly enhance both comfort and learning.

Their generosity reflects a deep understanding and sincere wish to improve the lives of our children. It

strengthens our shared mission to nurture, educate, and preserve Tibetan culture and tradition—a mission TCV has carried forward with dedication for over five decades.
